

- The oldest women's Republican club on record was founded in Salt Lake City in 1899.
- There were 140 clubs in Indiana alone by the late 1930s.
- In 1938, Marion Martin, assistant chairman of the Republican National Committee, called a meeting at the Palmer House in Chicago to organize these clubs into a national organization.
- It was known as the National Federation of Republican Women's Clubs.
- A local club had to have members in 60 percent of the counties of that state.
- Later this rule was changed to cover either 50 percent of the counties or 75 percent of the state's congressional districts.
- Eleven states became the charter states of NFRW CA, CO, CT, DC, IN, MD, MI, MO, MT, NJ and PA.
- Joyce Arneill of Denver, C0 was elected the first president.



- All 50 states are members of the Federation, plus DC and Puerto Rico
- Alabama & Alaska were the last 2 states to join in 1962, with Puerto Rico joining in 1963.






- In 1955, 38 years after the NFRW officially formed, Texas finally had sufficient numbers of clubs to join the National Federation (clubs in 75% of the state's congressional districts).
- In October 1955, more than 300 delegates met in the White Plaza Hotel in San Antonio for the Texas organizational convention.
- Mrs. Malcolm Milburn of Austin presided over the convention, and Mrs. R. D. O'Callaghan of San Antonio was elected president of the new Federation. The Executive Committee donated funds for stationery and the first letter was mailed to members of local clubs.


